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Setting the Atmosphere for Miracles through Thanksgiving

Thankfulness and gratefulness are key components in establishing the atmosphere for the miraculous in the physical realm. The word of God shows us this time and time again.

Jesus, even in his darkest hour, the night he was betrayed gave thanks. What followed was his death, burial, and the miraculous resurrection.

Jesus good friend Lazarus had died. As Jesus headed to the tomb to raise him from the dead, it says He groaned in the Spirit (John 11:33 & 38). What is groaning in the Spirit according to Romans 8:26-27? It is praying in tongues. When we groan in the Spirit, pray in tongues, we are partnering with the Holy Spirit and praying according to God's perfect will. Notice what Jesus did and said right before he raised Lazarus from the dead. *Then they took away the stone from the place where the dead man was lying. And Jesus lifted up His eyes and said, "Father, I thank You that You have heard Me* (John 11:41). He offered **thanksgiving** to God the Father before performing His greatest miracle. He said you have heard me, yet He did not utter anything in his known language. He groaned in the spirit. Prayed according to



God's perfect will for Lazarus. He thanked the Father and said *Lazarus come forth* (John 11:43)! After being dead for 4 days he came forth!

The Apostle Paul's attitude, even while in prison was one of gratitude and thanksgiving. *Not that I speak in regard to need, for I have learned in whatever state I am, to be content: I know how to be abased, and I know how to abound. Everywhere and in all things I have learned both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need. I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me* (Philippians 4:11-13). With this mindset, he could do all things through Christ who strengthened him.

In Acts 16:16-40 we read the story about Paul and Silas, who cast a demon out of a slave girl, who had a spirit of divination. As a result, the owners of this slave girl forced the magistrates to beat them and throw them in prison. In Acts 16:25 it says *But at midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to*

God, and the prisoners were listening to them. During their darkest hour at midnight, they lifted up their voices in praise and thanksgiving to God, and the prisoners heard them. Suddenly, there was a great earthquake, the prison was shaken and the prison doors came open, the jailer and his family ended up getting saved. Heaven intervened in an atmosphere of gratefulness and thankfulness.

It may be your darkest hour right now, just like Paul. **Praise Him through** that midnight hour and watch heaven intervene. 1 Thessalonians 5:18 says *in everything* (Greek way, manner and place) *give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.* Many believers have the attitude or belief that no matter what happens we need to praise the Lord **for** that circumstance, even if it's demonic. I do not praise the Lord, for something evil or demonic believing it's God's will, but **I praise him through that circumstance in every way, manner and in every place**, knowing the powerful weapon of praise and gratefulness to our God.

Jesus said *Have you never read, 'Out of the mouth of babes and nursing infants You have perfected praise'?"* Jesus was quoting Psalms 8:2 which reads differently. *Out of the mouth of babes and nursing infants You have ordained **strength**, Because of Your enemies, That*

*You may **silence the enemy and the avenger.*** Praise, thanksgiving and gratefulness = **Strength and power to silence the demonic.**

Jesus faced an impossible circumstance when he was confronted with the need to feed the multitudes (5000 +), all he had was a few loaves and a few fish. What did he do? *Jesus took the loaves and when he had given thanks, he distributed to the disciples...* (John 6:11). He gave thanks! Multiplication! After feeding the multitude, there was more loaves and more fish left over than what he started with.

Being unthankful and ungrateful breeds unbelief. Look at the children of Israel after coming out of Egypt witnessing so many undeniable miracles. In Numbers 13:30-33 is a sad story of when the 12 spies went to spy out the land and 10 of them came back with a negative report saying they were unable to take the land, even though God said he would give them the land. Their hearts were filled with ungratefulness and unthankfulness. As a result, unbelief set in and their confession became negative. Notice what God said to Moses. In Numbers 14:26- 30 *And the Lord spoke to Moses and Aaron, saying, "How long shall I bear with this evil congregation who complain against Me? **I have heard the complaints** which the children of Israel make against Me. Say to them, 'As I*

*live,' says the Lord, **'just as you have spoken in My hearing, so I will do to you: The carcasses of you who have complained against Me shall fall in this wilderness, all of you who were numbered, according to your entire number, from twenty years old and above. Except for Caleb and Joshua, you shall by no means enter the land which I swore I would make you dwell in.***

They spent the next 40 years wandering in the wilderness, until they perished in the wilderness. They never entered into the promised land. 40 years later, Joshua sent spies into the promised land. In Joshua 2:9-11 Rahab said to the spies *I know that the Lord has given you the land, that the terror of you has fallen on us, and that all the inhabitants of the land are fainthearted because of you. For we have heard how the Lord dried up the water of the Red Sea for you when you came out of Egypt.... And as soon as we heard these things, our hearts melted; neither did there remain any more courage in anyone because of you, for the Lord your God, He is God in heaven above and on earth beneath.* The ones delivered from Egypt never entered the promised land. 40 years earlier, they could've conquered the promised land. How many people miss out entering into the promises that God gave them for their life because of being ungrateful,

unthankful, complaining and unbelief?

The younger generation entered into the promised land, kept their mouths shut for seven days, while marching around Jericho, then gave a great shout, the walls of Jericho came tumbling down and the promised land was theirs.

*How often they prove Him in the wilderness, And grieved Him in the desert! Yes, again and again **they tempted God, And limited the Holy One of Israel. They did not remember His power:*** *The day when He redeemed them from the enemy, When He worked His signs in Egypt* (Psalms 78:40-43). Let's examine three things that the children of Israel did that were so wicked in the eyes of the Lord. #1 they tempted God! #2 they limited the Holy One of Israel. Our God is unlimited yet notice the children of Israel, limited God by being ungrateful, unthankful, complaining and unbelief. Why? Wherever you see ungratefulness, unthankfulness and complaining, unbelief will be right behind hindering and limiting the Holy One of Israel. #3 They did not remember his power! This is what happens when we are ungrateful and unthankful. It's so important to go down memory lane and to be grateful and thankful to our great God for all the good things and the blessings He's provided in our life. It creates an

atmosphere for a continuation of his miracle intervention.

When we forget, the works of the Lord, that's when unbelief will set in and we lose our passion for God, leading to things like backsliding and even atheism. Paul says *For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even His eternal power and Godhead, so that **they are without excuse, because, although they knew God, they did not glorify Him as God, nor were thankful, but became futile in their thoughts, and their foolish hearts were darkened*** (Romans 1:20-21). You can tell where someone's walk is with the Lord based on whether they are thankful or grateful to the Lord or not. Jesus said *out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks* (Matthew 12:34). Being grateful and thankful is a heart issue. If it's really in our heart, it will come out of our mouth. Your degree of gratefulness and thankfulness is a good indicator of how closely we are walking with Jesus.

About 1/3rd of marriages in the USA end in divorce and Christians are not exempt from this plague. Unfortunately, many we know, after years of marriage grow apathetic toward each other, throw in the towel and get divorced. It did not happen overnight. It was a progression. I believe a big part

of that was they no longer showed gratefulness, thankfulness and affection for one another. I believe leading cause of divorce can many times be ungratefulness or unthankfulness for one another. Sharmila and I almost daily when we're together, affirm and verbalize our gratefulness for each other.

There are times we argue and disagree with each other. During those times, we don't really feel like we're grateful or thankful for one another but we still offer love and gratefulness to one another. Somehow the atmosphere shifts. Hebrews 13:15 says *Therefore by Him let us continually offer the sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of our lips, giving thanks to His name.* We know this is talking about our relationship with Christ. Ephesians 5:21-33 talks about Christ and the church and compares it to a marriage between a husband and a wife. The same principal can work in a marriage. We may not feel like offering gratefulness or praise to our mate during an argument but that is a perfect time to let what's in your heart, gratefulness and thankfulness come out of your mouth, to shift that atmosphere from strife to unity and love.

My father passed away on Memorial Day at age 90. He suffered with dementia, had fallen and broken his hip along with other problems. Despite

going through all these problems this past year, my mother told me that he constantly was thanking her for marrying him and was so grateful for their marriage of nearly 70 years. Divorce was never an option for them because they kept their hearts filled with gratefulness and thankfulness for one another no matter how difficult life became.

Jesus said *Therefore I say to you, whatever things you ask when you pray, believe that you receive them, and you will have them* (Mark 11:24). What is the best way to believe that we receive after we have been prayed over? #1 start thanking him for answering that prayer. #2 confess his word concerning His promises, along with thanking him for what his word says. Over the years I've seen so many prayers answered this way and not always instantly. This is when faith is needed. If my prayers are immediately answered, I no longer need faith for the answer. Faith is required when it hasn't manifested in this natural realm. I thank Him for health and prosperity even when my body is suffering with an infirmity or I have a pressing financial need, not ignoring the problem. I know that it creates an atmosphere for His intervention. I've seen this work time and time again in my life.

On my first trip to India, I was believing and confessing I would see blind eyes opened, even though I had never

witnessed this before other than in the Bible or with other ministries. In my first open air outreach in India 3,000 people gathered. After my message, sharing a little about faith and Mark 11:24. I invited anyone who was blind to come up to the front. A woman who was totally blind for 20 years was brought to the stage. I told the crowd that I would rebuke the blind spirit and because Jesus is alive, He would open her blind eyes. I took authority in the name of Jesus, commanded the blindness to go and stood back and ask her if she could see. She said NO! I wasn't sure what to do next, but I'm glad she knew what to do. She lifted her hands and begin to praise Jesus for opening her blind eyes, even though she was still totally blind. Within five minutes she saw a vision of the Bible in her head and her blind eyes popped open. She demonstrated her miracle by grabbing my cheek. Since that time we've seen many hundreds of people healed supernaturally of blindness, most times instantly and sometimes over a process of time.

Many Christians have lost the joy of their salvation, for serving Christ because their focus has become distorted by ungratefulness and being unthankful. There are things in this life that can dull our joy. Being unthankful and ungrateful can rob our joy. It blurs our spiritual vision, our

passion for Christ and our passion for winning the lost. It can lead to depression, discouragement, spiritual oppression and heaviness. Isaiah 61:3 tells us put on *The garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness*. Nehemiah 8:10 says *the joy of the Lord is your strength*. If Satan cannot steal our joy, thankfulness, gratefulness, then he can't steal our goods. He can't steal our health, peace, finances, marriage, children, promises, future, etc. Hold onto that joy, gratefulness, thanksgiving because it is an expression of our faith in God that we believe He will come through. These things set the spiritual atmosphere for His miraculous intervention in this natural realm.

When being unthankful and ungrateful is unchecked in our lives, it can progress leading to divorce, bitterness, resentment, the critical spirit, judging and even bring on health problems and create an environment of unbelief. Doctors tell us today that negative emotions like unforgiveness, bitterness, anger, etc. can release a poison toxin in our bodies that can produce such things as cancer, arthritis and other health related problems.

Being ungrateful and unthankful can also cause us to progress to where we blame God for our problems. God is not our problem! He's the answer to our problems! Remember, we don't thank Him for the problems, but through the problems. Keep our hearts full of joy, gratefulness, and thanksgiving towards God and watch Him intervene on our behalf.

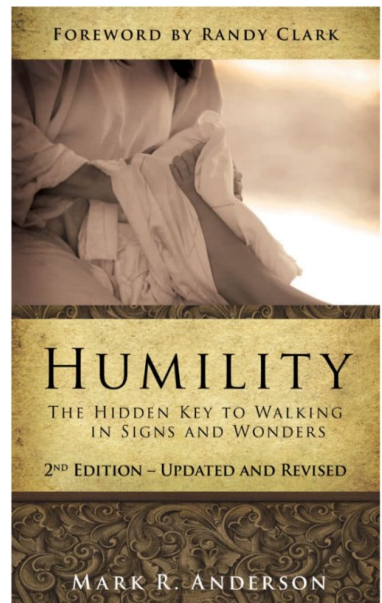
During the dark years of Covid, Sharmila and I constantly hit the rewind button and would spend many evenings remembering his goodness, in worship and praise to our God, as well as partaking of communion, to put us in remembrance of the sacrifice Jesus made, and the good things he had provided in our lives. During that three year period I was not sick once. Sharmila got sick once, for a very short time. We refused to be vaccinated, social distance, or wear a mask most of the time, when it was mandatory. I was around many people who had Covid, praying for them and ministering to them, but God's supernatural power kept us at that time.
